# <u>Headlice</u>

### <u>CHECK</u>

· Your child's hair once a week.

 $\cdot$  Use a proper detection comb to trap head lice.

· If you find live lice, consult a pharmacist for treatment advice immediately.

· If head lice are spotted, take a close look at all the family.

# TREAT

· Please treat your child with a clinically proven treatment.

 $\cdot$  Leave the treatment on for the recommended time for maximum effect.

 $\cdot$  Repeat the treatment for a second time seven days after the original treatment to kill any  $\,$  eggs that may hatch after the first treatment.

 $\cdot$  Continue to check for head lice on a regular, weekly basis.

Children who are being treated for head lice can still attend school.

Whenever possible, long hair should be tied up.
